

#### Hackney NEU District Meeting 29th March

#### **1. Fixed Business**

Meeting heard from Daniel Kebede, NEU Senior Vice President, who spoke on the experience in school over the past year during the pandemic.

Positives included new members recruited to the union, new reps, action taken around Section 44. No high stakes testing or Ofsted. Daniel also outlined areas where it is important that we continue to fight.

Discussion followed with reports from schools.

#### 2. Secretary's Report

a. Leaways - members are meeting now to discuss strike tomorrow. Leaways is a private school, owned by the Kedleston Group which belongs to the Brosnan family.

Rep has been dismissed. Management are considering forcing everyone to re-apply for their jobs. Discussing with the national union to launch a fight across the Kedleston Group, who do not want any union organisation in their schools.

Picket lines around Leaways - groups of six. Kevin Courtney and Diane Abbott planning to attend picket. Messages of support very important. Wednesday lunchtime online strike rally - Dave to circulate details.

b. Parkwood - balloting for action against redundancies. Indicative ballot result was 100% yes, with 100% turnout.

Proposal to contact Irish TUC. And for twitter storm.
