

Minutes for GM 15.01.24

- 1.No requests for suspensions
- 2. Minutes from last GM 20.11.23 agreed. No matters arising. RR thanked HNEU for support for DHM

MOTIONS FOR GM 15.01.24

The following motions were discussed

Cuba Solidarity Campaign - affiliation motion

Hackney NEU notes that

2024 marks the 62nd anniversary of the US's illegal blockade of Cuba despite 29 UN General Assembly majority votes calling for its termination.

The US enforces this blockade even to trade from countries that do not support it

The blockade causes shortages across all sectors in Cuba, including education and health.

During the COVID-19 pandemic the blockade added to the suffering and loss of life on the island by preventing purchase and delivery of vital equipment and medicines to treat patients and the roll out Cuba's vaccination programme.

In 2021, Oxfam reported that, during the pandemic, the US blockade slowed the use of new technologies - like zoom or teams - for teaching and forced Cuba to resort to broadcasting daily classes to 1.7 million students on television.

NEU members who have participated in delegations to Cuba all agree that the blockade is the fundamental hindrance to educational development in Cuba and results in noticeable shortages in Cuban classrooms.

Hackney NEU welcomes:

The £100,000 raised for the 'Viva La Educación' appeal which sent two containers of education aid to Cuban schools in 2023.

Hackney NEU agrees

To support the call for an end to the US blockade.

To affiliate to the Cuba Solidarity Campaign at an annual cost of £40

To make a donation to the CSC of £100

Care4Calais

Hackney NEU notes:

The fantastic work done by NEU members visiting Calais to support Care4Calais with distributions and warehouse work.

A 79-page report from Human Rights Watch, "Enforced Misery: The Degrading Treatment of Migrant Children and Adults in Northern France," documents repeated mass eviction operations, near-daily police harassment, and restrictions on provision of and access to humanitarian assistance. The authorities carry out these abusive practices with the primary purposes of forcing people to move elsewhere, without resolving their migration status or lack of housing.

Care4Calais are currently distributing 485 food parcels per week at a cost of £15 per parcel. That is a cost of £7275 per week, £29,100 per month and £378,300 per year. This provides a very basic food parcel to each person.

This district/branch agrees to:

- 1. Invite a NEU speaker who has visited Calais to talk about their experience and how people can get involved.
- 2. To reaffiliate and donate £100 to C4C
- 3. To encourage members to take a trip to Calais to support their efforts.
- 4. To fully fund 100% of costs (£70 hotel, £25 for all meal expenses and £50 for travel) for up to 6 delegates a year. After 6 delegates we will part fund for additional members.
- 5. Continue to show solidarity with refugees and commit to raising refugee issues in school where possible including holding assemblies, fundraising and exploring becoming schools of sanctuary.
- 6. Encourage members to become active in local C4C groups.
